The 2006-07 Programme of the Society's events is enclosed with this newsletter. The lectures cover a wide range of topics with a particular focus on Lecale and should be of interest to members.

Opening Lecture: 'The Dawn of the Ulster Scots'

This year is the 400th anniversary of the Hamilton and Montgomery Settlement in County Down.

To celebrate this event, Mark Thompson, chairman of the Ulster Scots Society, is the lecturer at the first meeting of the season on **Monday 18**th **September.**

Special Meeting in Ardglass

In the last two years the Committee has tried to broaden the appeal of the Society throughout Lecale by staging some talks outside Downpatrick. Following the success of visits to Killough and Dundrum, the October meeting and the June Annual Outing will take place in Ardglass.

The meeting on **Monday, 16th October** will be held at 7.30pm in the Presbyterian Hall, Hill Street, Ardglass (turn right at cross roads if coming from Downpatrick). Local historian George Rice will give an illustrated history of Ardglass. This will be followed up by the Annual Outing on 19th June 2007 when George Rice will lead a guided walk around Ardglass.

Launch of Lecale Review 2006

In November the launch takes place of the fourth *Lecale Review* which records and encourages interest in our local history.

The President of the Society, Dr James Hawthorne, will be speaker at the Review launch on **Monday 20th November** and the evening will include musical entertainment and supper. This is a special evening for members to bring along friends and guests to take part in the occasion.

The *Lecale Review 2006* is free to members (one copy per subscription) and additional copies will be available at £7 per copy.

1901 Census of Lecale -- Update from Billy Stranney and Pat Devlin

The project to put the complete Census on the Society's website started in May and has been making steady progress. Although it is not certain until all of the microfilm has been transcribed, we estimate the total number of townlands involved to be 198, plus Downpatrick, Ardglass, Annsborough, Ballyhornan, Dundrum, Killough, Raholp and Strangford. Of these, 64 townlands, Annsborough, Downpatrick, Dundrum and Killough have been completed.

Uniquely, the project also provides for a complete index of all the people named in the census forms, pointing to their location in the record. To date this index lists almost 8,000 people and this will grow substantially as transcription progresses.

We have added features, such as interactive maps, to enable readers/researchers to find parishes/townlands linking to the census information.

Regular updates are provided so that people can easily check progress.

We are grateful to those who have let us know about corrections to the record, mainly based on family research, where the microfilm has been unclear. We encourage this support and provide on-line acknowledgement of such help.
