#### Programme of Events for 2010 - 2011

#### **Opening Lecture:**

#### Sir Hans Sloane 1660-1735

His life and legacy

Our season begins on **Monday, 20<sup>th</sup> September** with **Dr Stanley Hawkins** giving a lecture to celebrate the 350<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the birth of Killyleagh's most famous son. Ireland. Among his many achievements, Sloane became President of the Royal Society and his collections formed the nucleus of the British Museum.

Dr Hawkins is a native of Downpatrick and is a noted expert on Sir Hans Sloane.

Monday 18<sup>th</sup> October is the date for a lecture on The Ancient Gold of County Down by Richard Warner, former curator of the Ulster Museum. Particular attention will be paid to the finds at Downpatrick and Inch.

#### **Launch of Lecale Review 2010**

In November the launch takes place of the eighth *Lecale Review*, the Society's journal, which records and encourages interest in our local history.

The launch is on **Monday, 15th November.** The evening will include musical entertainment and supper. This is a special evening for members to bring along friends and quests to take part in the occasion.

The Lecale Review 2010 is free to members (one copy per subscription) and additional copies will be available at £8 per copy.

### County Down Library Collection



The Library Headquarters in Ballynahinch housed an extensive collection of material relating to County Down. The Lecale and Downe Historical Society took part in the consultation process regarding the future of the Library and stressed the importance of keeping the Co. Down collection intact and accessible.

The decision has now been taken to close the Ballynahinch building but the County Down collection will be relocated to the library in Downpatrick. This will be more accessible in terms of location and opening times.

#### Public Record Office NI (PRONI) Temporary Closure

The Public Record Office in Balmoral Avenue, Belfast will be closed between September 2010 and May 2011, prior to the opening of the new PRONI headquarters at Titanic Quarter. This is to ensure that services in the new building will be operational.

In order to minimise disruption to customers, PRONI is increasing the amount and range of material which will be available online including the 1819 to 1900 street directories. Whilst the public will not be able to physically access the Balmoral Avenue site during the move, PRONI will continue to provide a limited correspondence and telephone enquiry service.
