The death has occurred of Mary Croskery who was one of the founding members of Lecale Historical Society. She lived in Ballystokes and recorded the history of the townland in the first *Lecale Miscellany* in 1983. She later hosted a memorable outing by the Society to the townland.

Betty McCord, who died recently in her 100th year, was a founding member of Lecale Historical Society. She was a distinguished artist who studied in the Royal College of Art in London. She will be remembered in Lecale for her work recording townland and field names for posterity.
